

FIATA documents: From paper to data



Negotiable FIATA Multimodal Transport Bill of Lading (FMBL)

More than 50 years ago FIATA started to establish **standard transport documents** to harmonize documents and forms used by freight forwarders. **Today FIATA is leading with the digitalisation of its standard transport documents**.



Non-negotiable FIATA Multimodal Transport Waybill (FWB)



FIATA Forwarders Certificate of Receipt (FCR)



FIATA Warehouse Receipt (FWR)



Digitalisation and corridor development: optimising performance and efficiency

- Development of the Digital FIATA multimodal bill of lading (Digital FBL) and eFBL
 Standard
- Reinforcing the **integrity and trustworthiness** of this crucial industry document (liability insurance requirements, possibility for tracking and verification by stakeholders)
- Unleashing **global connectivity and interoperability** pilots initiated in Autumn 2022 with Carriers, Customs, Trade finance banks using blockchain technology
- Working to **facilitate greater international legal recognition** of multimodal transport documents and paperless trade

Save \$6.5 B in documentation costs

Enable \$7 B in gains by reducing inventory and financing costs

Unlock \$30-40 B in trade growth by reducing trade friction

Save **28,000** trees



The Global Voice of Logistics as a key driver in corridor efficiency

Fostering swifter border clearance

- Providing industry recommendations to customs through the WCO and WCO-PSCG on the effective development and implementation of trade facilitation measures e.g. AEO, digitalisation
- Fostering industry best practices and ensuring appropriate risk management systems (e.g. dangerous goods, CTU code)

Conducting capacity-building and boosting skilled logistics manpower

- Empowering industry talent by offering recognised industry courses e.g. the FIATA diploma (the only globally-recognised vocational training certificate for logistics)
- Raising the next generation of industry talent through the FIATA Young Logistics Professionals award



Harnessing FIATA's global network to foster dialogue and international cooperation

- Developing expertise through FIATA institutes and bodies (e.g. WG Rail as part of the Multimodal Transport Institute)
- Providing industry expertise and recommendations at the intergovernmental level on industry needs and developments to support new corridors and modal shifts
- Fostering a platform for multi-stakeholder industry dialogue to share knowledge and best practices in collaboration with other industry bodies – e.g. on Latin American, Middle and Southern Corridors, and China-Europe routes


